

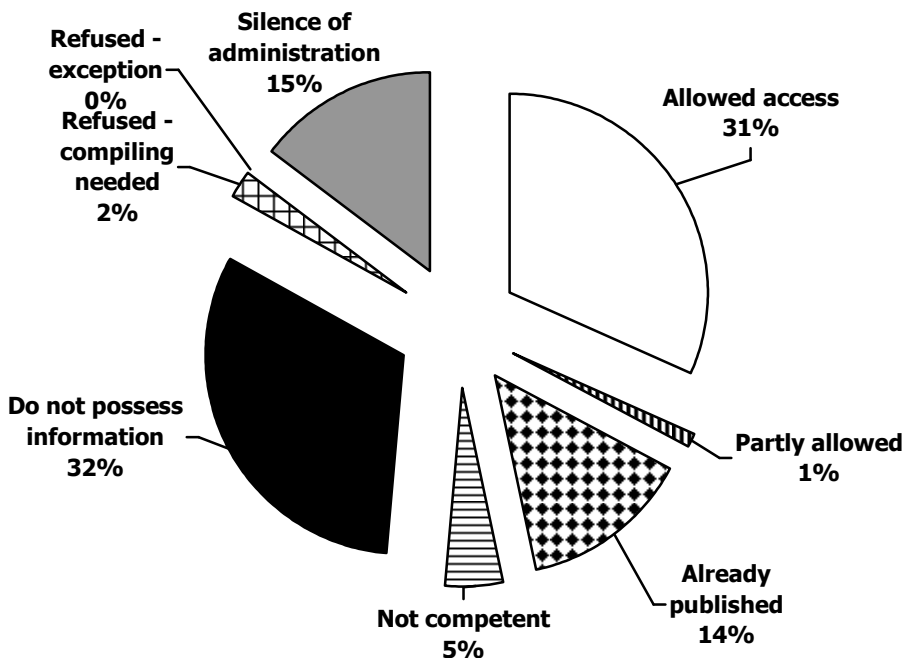
## 6. STATISTICAL DATA



Free access to information is prescribed by the Law on Free Access to Information, but also by the Law on General Administrative Procedure. Apart from submission of a request, the procedure of access to information can include also a repeated request, in case of silence of administration of institutions which do not have a second instance body, or a complaint and repeated complaint which are submitted to a second instance body<sup>1</sup>.

In the period of seven months MANS submitted 130 requests for information referring to the field of environment protection. Of that, for 42 requests or 32% we obtained the requested information, access to one information was partly allowed, 18 of the requested information had already been published (14%), and for 6 requests the institutions declared themselves not competent, while for 42 requests (32%) they did not have the information. Access was not denied to any of the requested information based on exceptions prescribed by the Law on Free Access to Information, and in the administrative procedure institutions did not respond to 19 requests (15%).
