I INTRODUCTION

MANS is implementing the project under the title "Improving of parliamentary monitoring and accountability in Montenegro", supported by the United Nations Democracy Fund (UNDEF). The project refers to monitoring transparency and activities of the Parliament of Montenegro and its MPs. Duration of the project is two years, and this is the fourth semi-annual report published by MANS, which relates to the period from May 1, 2019, to December 31, 2019.

On the basis of results of the parliamentary elections held on October 16, 2016, the Democratic Party of Socialists (DPS) won 36 seats, Democratic Front (DF) 18, coalition Ključ 9, Democratic Montenegro (DCG) 8, the Bosniak Party (BS) and the Social Democrats (SD) two seats, Albanians Decisively and the Croatian Civic Initiative (HGI) one each, while the Social Democratic Party (SDP) won 4 seats.

The Parliament of Montenegro was formed on November 7, 2016. Out of 81 MPs in Montenegro's Parliament, 42 elected the president and vice-presidents of the Parliament - Ivan Brajović, Branimir Gvozdenović and Genci Nimanbegu. Thus, the parliamentary majority consists of DPS, SD, and minority parties of Bosniaks, Albanians and Croats, while 39 opposition MPs (DF, Democratic Montenegro, SD, DEMOS, SNP and Civic movement URA) have agreed to boycott the Parliament of Montenegro.

Majority of Montenegrin opposition ended the boycott of the work of the Parliament that occurred due to parliamentary elections held on October 16, 2016. The opposition claimed they had not been held in a democratic atmosphere. Namely, on the election day, it was announced that the attempt of "coup" had taken place, which, according to the opposition parties, influenced the decision of the citizens and the election result. The opposition requested to repeat parliamentary elections as a condition to end the boycott. In the previous report on activities of the MPs relating to the period from November 1, 2018 to April 30, 2019, the work of the Parliament was boycotted by 11 opposition MPs. In this reporting period, this number decreased to 9, and currently the Parliament is being boycotted by the MPs of Democratic Montenegro and URA.

This report provides information on individual activities of MPs, most active MPs at the plenary sessions and MPs who did not request to speak at the plenary sessions. The work of MPs Groups, the work of MPs at the plenary sessions of the Parliament, as well as the control function of the Parliament were analysed.

The most active MP in the observed period was Raško Konjević (SDP), whose activity index was 12.02, while MPs Nedžad Drešević, Džavid Šabović and Tarzan Milošević had an activity index of 0.00, which means that they had no activity at the plenum.

In the period from May 1 to December 31, 2019, 17 sittings of the Parliament were held, and total duration was 345 hours. MPs Group of DPS had most discussions, 728, while individually, Raško Konjević had most discussions, 92.

II ABSTRACT

In the past eight months, the Parliament worked more intensely compared to the previous reporting period (November 1, 2018 - April 30, 2019), although MPs of part of the opposition, 9 of them, continue to boycott the work of the Parliament.

From May 1 to December 31, 2019, 17 sittings were held to discuss 126 laws and other legislation.

In the reporting period, MPs spent 43 working days at the plenum or a total of 345 hours, with the longest work in December - less than 10 working days, and the shortest in June - only three hours.

In this reporting period, MPs were more active during plenary sessions compared to the previous reports. 45 MPs actively participated in the work of the plenum, 18% of MPs were medium active, 13% were rarely active, and belong to inactive group of MPs when it comes to work at the plenary sessions.

The most active MP in this period was Raško Konjević from the Social Democratic Party (SDP). From the Special MPs Group, among most active MPs was Aleksandar Damjanović. Out of first five most active MPs, two are from DF, Branko Radulović and Branka Bošnjak. Predrag Sekulić, MP from DPS, is at the fifth place according to activity.

Among MPs Groups, the most active were members of SDP, followed by SD and LP MPs Group while DF is in the third place. Special MPs Group is in the fourth place, while DPS is in the fifth place according to activity. It is followed by MPs Group of minority parties, while SNP-DEMOS MPs Group is in the last place.

As of October 1, 2018, recording of the activities of MPs by topics has been carried out and it is a summing up of the total work of MPs by agenda items whose area/topic was previously defined. All items on the agenda are classified into three topics, divided into three categories: legal and political, economic, and social, which are further divided into subcategories, and the activities of MPs by topics are also classified within these categories.

When it comes to legal and political topics, the most active were Rasko Konjević, Jovanka Laličić, Halil Duković, Milorad Vuletić, Andrija Nikolić and Luid Škrelja. Boris Mugoša, Raško Konjević, Filip Vuković, Genci Nimanbegu and Petar Ivanović had most discussions on economic topics. In the end, MPs Andrija Popović, Raško Konjević, Suad Numanović and Branka Tanasijević paid most attention to social topics.

In order to improve day-to-day communication between citizens and MPs, NGO MANS developed a mobile application "Ask MPs" for all mobile platforms, and from July to the end of December this year, citizens sent 200 questions to their representatives in the Parliament of Montenegro, and received answer to 70 questions.

SDP MPs received most questions - Draginja Vuksanović Stanković (21 questions) and Raško Konjević (10 questions), while Andrija Popović, MP from SD and LP MPs Group, received nine questions. Nine questions also received DPS MP Aleksandra Vuković, eight questions received MPs Aleksandar Damjanović and Branka Bošnjak respectively, while six questions each were addressed to Aleksa Bečić and Nebojša Medojević. Other MPs received five or less questions.

When it comes to answers of the MPs to citizens' questions, ten MPs actively provided answers, eight were medium active, and as many as 50 MPs did not provide a single answer to the questions asked, and it can be said that they were not responsible when it comes to this activity.

The Parliament does not perform the control role actively, and in a few cases when the control mechanisms are used, concrete obligations of the executive authorities are often not precisely specified, and there is no system for monitoring their implementation. In the past eight months, the Parliament's committees organized 3 control and 14 consultative hearings, where 110 people were questioned.

During this reporting period, by using control mechanisms, 41 conclusions were adopted that are binding on the executive authorities and other institutions. However, 45% of these conclusions are general and their implementation cannot be monitored, 32% of conclusions are somewhat measurable, while 23% define specific obligations of institutions. The Parliament has no system of monitoring the implementation of conclusions, which significantly reduces its capacity to perform the constitutional duty when it comes to controlling the work of the executive authorities.

The Committee on Further Reform of Electoral and Other Legislation, which aimed to establish dialogue and strengthen public trust in the electoral process, ceased to exist because it did not have a quorum for decision-making. MPs from DF boycott the Committee due to arrest of MP Nebojša Medojević, while members of the Committee of the ruling majority, academic community and civil sector continued to work in certain working groups on electoral solutions without the presence of DF members, and were joined in July by the MPs of Democrats. Although it was planned that the legal solutions would be completed by the end of the first week of December, Democrat MPs Momo Koprivica and Danilo Šaranović left the Committee due to submitting to the parliamentary procedure the Draft Law on freedom of religion because they claimed that it was not supported by all three traditional religions in Montenegro, and that this would lead to new divisions among citizens. MPs of the ruling coalition submitted to the parliamentary procedure and adopted a set of laws that the working committees worked on.

III METHODOLOGY

MPs ACTIVITY INDEX

Below is an overview of the methodology on the basis of which MANS monitors and analyzes the activities of MPs at plenary sessions, as well as the methodology of classification and monitoring of implementation of the conclusions of the Parliament.

Activity Index (AI) implies summing up of the total work of MPs of the Parliament of Montenegro at the plenary sessions. This index shows for each MP individually whether, from the point of view of activities at the plenum, they justified the salary received by the taxpayers of Montenegro in order to represent the citizens in the Parliament.

It is especially important to note that MANS is certainly aware of the fact that the work of the MPs does not imply only his/her presence and discussion at the plenary sessions. In addition, MPs should perform other important tasks, such as analysing of legal projects, various research, drafting amendments, as well drafting legislation, participation in the work of committees, MPs groups and certainly work with voters, which does not have to be visible through activities at the plenary sessions.

In addition, it is a known fact that every presence of MPs at the sittings of the Parliament may not always be constructive and contribute to the quality of its work. However, it cannot be disputed that through the presence and participation in the work of the Parliament and the committees, as is the obligation prescribed by Article 55 of the Rules of Procedure¹, an MP expresses his/her attitude towards the institution in which he/she is working and towards the citizens who appointed him/her to that office.

This index certainly does not tend to, or can fully evaluate the quality of work of each MP, but intends to point out to this aspect of parliamentary duty. After all, citizens should be the ones to determine whether they are satisfied with the overall work of the MPs and decide on this in the elections.

The criteria for increasing the MP's activity index are the number of discussions, discussion comments, responses to discussion comments, responses, and grounded procedural reactions.

Parameters that reduce their activity index are the number of measures imposed due to violation of order at the Parliament sittings, the number of warnings, the number of bars from speaking and the number of dismissals from sessions.

The formula based on which the MP's activity index is obtained looks like this:

The numbers with which positive parameters that make up the activity index are multiplied are directly correlated with duration of presenting at the plenary sessions.

Number of discussions is multiplied with number 0.10, which represents duration of discussion of 10 minutes. Despite the fact that the discussions in debates last 5 minutes individually, the number 0.10 seemed adequate because there is a huge difference in the number of discussions that were used in principled and joint discussions (almost 96%) and the number of discussions in details (around 4%). In support of such parameters is the fact that a discussion of any kind requires much greater preparation than other types of presentation.

For comments on discussions, responses to comments, and responses, the multiplier is 0.03, which represents a duration of 3 minutes for each of the categories individually. Reaction for violation of the Rules of Procedure, only the grounded one, is multiplied with 0.01, since for this form of presenting the Rules of Procedure stipulates duration of 1 minute.

Activity index of MPs Groups is calculated by the arithmetic mean of the index of activities of MPs belonging to it.

ACTIVITIES OF MPs BY TOPICS

The Activity Index of MPs by topic has been implemented since 01 October 2018 and it is a summary of the total work of MPs by agenda items whose area/topic was previously defined. All items on the agenda are divided into three topics, which are divided into three categories: legal and political, economic, and social, which are further divided into subcategories:

Any activity of an MP within the discussion on the agenda items whose area/topic was previously defined is further qualified based on whether the MP speaks on the topic of the agenda item. Thus, each statement of an MP during the debate is further multiplied by weighting coefficients: within topic, mostly within topic, mostly off topic, and off topic.

CONCLUSIONS

By using the mechanism of conclusions, at plenary sessions or through the work of committees, the Parliament may issue instructions to institutions on acting in a particular field. Based on the collected conclusions during this convocation of the Parliament, they are grouped into categories according to the degree of measurability, i.e. the way in which they can be monitored. On this basis, three categories of conclusions are distinguished:

1. **MEASURABLE CONCLUSIONS:** contain specific instructions or measures and specify the method in acting in particular field.
2. **PARTLY MEASURABLE CONCLUSIONS:** contain instructions and recommendations for improvement, but do not define specific measures. They lack explicitly stated guidelines for acting, so it is quite difficult to quantify the degree of implementation.
3. **NON-MESURABLE CONCLUSIONS:** note progress in a particular area and welcome the implemented items. They do not contain instructions or specific measures to be taken.

IV ACTIVITIES OF THE MPs AND THE PARLIAMENT

This chapter provides an overview of values of the MPs index, which shows their activity at the plenary sessions. In addition to the MPs index, the index of MP's groups as well as their amendment activity are also provided. According to activity, MPs are grouped into three categories: active, medium-active and inactive MPs. In addition to this, this chapter also contains information on the activity index of MP's Groups. In addition, statistics on the Parliament sittings, such as duration and types of items, are also presented, while at the very end there is a review of the control function of the Parliament, which includes control and consultative hearings, as well as review of conclusions.

1. ACTIVITIES OF MPs AND THE MPs GROUPS

1.1. MPs

According to their activity, the MPs are divided into three groups: active, medium-active and inactive. Members of the active group include MPs with activity index greater than 2.00, medium-active between 1.00 and 2.00, while the inactive group includes MPs with activity index less than 1.00. It is important to note that the tables do not include MPs who boycott the work of the Parliament.² There is 9 such MPs and their names are listed in Annex 1 of this report.

Active MPs include those with activity index greater than 2.00. There were 45 active MPs in the observed period, and the greatest index had Raško Konjević from SDP, i.e. 12.02. In second place is Branko Radulović from DF, whose activity index is 10.81, while in third place is Aleksandar Damjanović from the Special MPs Group, whose activity index is 9.17. In fourth place is Branka Bošnjak whose activity index is 9.14.

All MPs from SD and LP MPs Group are in this group: Andrija Popović, Boris Mugoša and Ivan Brajović, whose activity index is 5.72, 4.53 and 3.37 respectively. Most active MPs from DPS were Predrag Sekulić and Jovanka Laličić. Jovan Vučurović and Milutin Đukanović were most active MPs from DF.

Place in this category of active MPs also took Genci Nimanbegu and Ervin Ibrahimović from MPs Group of minority parties BS, coalition "Albanians Decisively" and HGI, as well as Nedeljko Rudović from SNP-DEMOS MPs Group.

The group of medium-active MPs includes those with activity index from 1.00 to 2.00. MPs Halil Duković, Goran Danilović and Luid Škrelja lead in this group. Their index is 1.97, 1.84 and 1.82 respectively.

In this category, most of the MPs are from DPS, 7 of them, while there are 3 MPs from DF. Two MPs are from Special MPs Group, and one MP each from MPs Group SNP-DEMOS and MPs Group BS, coalition “Albanians Decisively” and HGI.

The group of inactive MPs consists of those with activity index less than 1.00. There are 18 inactive MPs in the Parliament, 10 from DPS, 2 from the Special MPs Group and one MP from MPs Group SNP-DEMOS and BS, coalition “Albanians Decisively” and HGI respectively.

MP Nedžad Drešević from MPs Group BS, coalition “Albanians Decisively” and HGI, Tarzan Milošević³ from DPS and Džavid Šabović from SDP are at the last place in this category. These MPs did not participate in the discussions and activities at the plenary sessions of the Parliament in the observed period.⁴

AMENDMENTS

Amendments to draft laws and other types of legislation that the Parliament is considering are one of the possibilities guaranteed by the Rules of Procedure of the Parliament of Montenegro that are available to MPs in order to amend the proposed legislation.

MPs, as submitters of amendments, have several ways to use this opportunity. An MP can submit an amendment independently, but one amendment may also be signed by several MPs or even on behalf of the party to which they belong.

On the agenda of all plenary sessions in the period covered by the report, there were 226 amendments, of which 11 were adopted, 47 amendments were withdrawn, while 168 amendments were not adopted. The Committee on Political System, Judiciary and Administration submitted nine amendments adopted at the plenary voting.

The MPs of DF submitted most of the amendments, 106 of them, of which none were adopted, while SDP MPs submitted 38 amendments, while two amendments submitted by Draginja Vuksanović Stanković from that MPs Group were adopted. MP of the Special MPs Group, Anka Vukićević, submitted 33 amendments, 29 of which were withdrawn and four were not adopted. SNP-DEMOS MPs submitted a total of 21 amendments, none of which were adopted. DPS MPs submitted seven amendments, and withdrew them.

SD and LP MP Andrija Popović submitted four amendments, two of which were withdrawn and two were not accepted. Genci Nimanbegu of the BS, coalition “Albanians Decisively” and HGI, submitted two amendments, and Ervin Ibrahimović submitted one amendment, which were withdrawn.

Compared to the previous semi-annual reports, there is an increase in the number of amendments submitted by MPs, but there is a significant decline in the number of amendments compared to the previous convocations of the Parliament, suggesting that the MPs are insufficiently involved in correction of legal solutions of the Government.

1.2. MPs GROUPS

In the observed period, the largest index of activities within the MPs groups had SDP, 5.19. Next is SD and LP MPs Group whose index is 4.54, while in the third place is DF, whose index is 3.87. The activity index of DPS is 2.35, while MPs Group BS, coalition “Albanians Decisively” and HGI have activity index 2.13. In the end, SNP-DEMOS has an index of 1.65.

Total number of discussions was 1724, out of which DPS had 728. Most of the comments in the observed period had DF who used this MPs’ right 132 times.

DF is followed by DPS with 60 comments. Total number of responses to comments was 420, and most of them had DPS - 161, while the MP's group BS, coalition "Albanians Decisively" and HGI had six responses to comments.

Number of MPs' reactions for violation of the Rules of Procedure amounted to 1200, majority of which by DF, 325. There were total of 52 responses, of which DPS had 26, DF 10, while MPs Group SD and LP had eight responses. SDP had seven responses, MPs Group of BS, coalition "Albanians Decisively" and HGI one response, while Special MPs Group and SNP-DEMOS had no responses in the observed period of the Parliament's work.

1.3. ACTIVITIES OF FEMALE MPs

Number of female MPs from MPs Groups who participated in the work of the Parliament of Montenegro in this reporting period was 22. The most active in this category was Branka Bošnjak from DF whose index is 9.14. Jovanka Laličić from DPS is in second place with activity index 4.79, while Draginja Vuksanović Stanković from SDP is in third place with activity index 4.60.

In this group, there are 13 MPs from DPS, 5 MPs from DF, 2 from Special MPs Group and one MP from SDP and SNP-DEMOS MPs Group respectively. In addition to taking first places in this category, 12 female MPs are also included in the group of active MPs in the period from May 01 to December 31, 2019. Activity index of two MPs from this group is between 1.00 and 2.00, which places them in the category of medium-active MPs. Based on the above, it can be concluded that women contribute greatly to the work of the Parliament, as indicated by their activity results.

1.4. ACTIVITIES OF YOUNG MPs

In the category of young MPs in the Parliament of Montenegro belong the ones of up to 35 years of age. All MPs in this category are from DPS MPs Group, while in other MPs Groups that participate in the work of the Parliament there are no MPs younger than 35 years of age.

During the observed period from May 01 to December 31, 2019, the most active among young MPs was Nikola Rakočević, whose index is 4.46. He is followed by Andrija Nikolić and Danijel Živković, whose index is 3.85 and 3.66 respectively. All MPs from this category are also in the group of active MPs.

2. ACTIVITIES OF MPs BY TOPICS

As of October 1, 2018, calculation of the activities of MPs by topics has been implemented and it is a summary of the total work of MPs by agenda items whose area/topic was previously defined. All items on the agenda are classified into three topics, which were divided into three categories: legal and political, economic, and social, which are further divided into subcategories, and the activities of MPs by topics are also classified within these categories. Below is an overview of the activity index of MPs⁵ by topics from 01 October, 2018, to 31 December, 2019.

2.1. Legal and political topics

Indices of activity of MPs within legal and political topics are divided into seven subcategories: anti-corruption, judiciary, human rights, public administration, security/defence, international relations and elections.

The most active MP when it comes to items on the agenda related to the anti-corruption is Raško Konjević, who also ranks first in the category of topics related to public administration and elections. He was also among the most active MPs within the topics devoted to justice and security and defence. In second place is Ivan Brajović, while Daliborka Pejović is in third. Among the most active in this category, besides the mentioned MPs, were also Aleksandar Damjanović and Ranko Krivokapić.

In the area of justice, Jovanka Laličić spoke most, followed by MPs Miloš Nikolić, Danijel Živković and Predrag Sekulić from DPS.

When it comes to human rights topics, the most active MPs are Halil Duković, Andrija Popović, Ervin Ibrahimović, Suad Numanović and Momčilo Martinović.

Topics devoted to public administration were most discussed at the plenary session, as evidenced by the figures of the MPs shown in the table below, and in addition to Raško Konjević, Marta Šćepanović, Jovanka Laličić, Boris Mugoša i Andrija Popović were also active in this area.

The most dedicated to items on the agenda related to security and defence were Milorad Vuletić, Genci Nimanbegu, Aleksandar Damjanović and Andrija Nikolić.

Finally, the most active on the topics of international relations are Andrija Nikolić, Dragutin Papović, Ivan Brajović, Momčilo Martinović and Adrijan Vuksanović.

In the area related to the elections, besides Raško Konjević, the most active was Luid Škrelja, followed by Ivan Brajović, Marta Šćepanović and Branka Bošnjak.

Below is a table showing the most active MPs on legal and political topics, while the complete overview of the activities of all MPs within this topic is provided in Annex 3.

2.2. Economic topics

Economic topics are divided into seven sub-categories: transport/infrastructure, public finances, energetics, tourism, agriculture, ecology and spatial planning.

Within economic topics, the most discussed was the public finances, and the most active MP was Raško Konjević. He was also among most active MPs in the topics related to transport and infrastructure, ecology and spatial planning.

Boris Mugoša, Andrija Popović, Milorad Vuletić and Predrag Sekulić were active when it comes to topics on traffic and infrastructure, while Aleksandar Damjanović, Branko Radulović, Predrag Sekulić and Ana Nikolić were also active on the topic of public finance, in addition to Raško Konjević.

Filip Vuković talked most about energetics, followed by Branko Radulović, Strahinja Bulajić, Predrag Sekulić and Sanja Pavićević.

Predrag Sekulić is among most active in the fields of transport and infrastructure, public finances and energy, while Petar Ivanović is among most active in the fields of tourism, agriculture, and ecology and spatial planning. Branko Radulović was among most active in the areas of public finance, energetics and ecology and spatial planning.

The topic of tourism was mostly discussed by Genci Nimanbegu and Petar Ivanović, followed by Nikola Rakočević, Momčilo Martinović and Marta Šćepanović.

Although agriculture was least discussed area at the plenary sessions of the Parliament, Petar Ivanović and Strahinja Bulajić were the most active, followed by Goran Danilović, Ervin Ibrahimović and Neđeljko Rudović. Petar Ivanović is ranked first in the field of ecology and spatial planning, followed by Raško Konjević, Sanja Pavićević, Branko Radulović and Aleksandar Damjanović.

Table 11 shows the most active MPs on economic topics, and a complete overview of the activities of all MPs in this area is provided in Annex 4.

2.3. Social topics

Social topics are divided into six sub-categories: culture, employment, healthcare, social protection, education and science, media and NGOs.

When it comes to topics classified as social topics, MPs paid most attention to healthcare, and least to the media and NGOs.

Draginja Vuksanović Stanković was among the most active in the field of healthcare, social protection, education and science, as well as the media and NGOs, and Branka Bošnjak was active in the topics of employment, healthcare, and education and science. Saud Numanović was among the most active in the areas of employment, healthcare and social protection.

Andrija Popović and Aleksandra Vuković discussed most about the culture, as well as MPs Ranko Krivokapić, Momčilo Martinović and Aleksandar Damjanović.

The most active on the topic of employment was Raško Konjević, followed by Anka Vukičević, Aleksandar Damjanović, Branka Bošnjak and Suad Numanović.

In the field of healthcare, besides Suad Numanović, Branka Bošnjak and Draginja Vuksanović Stanković, the most active were Raško Konjević and Halil Duković.

MPs Maja Bakrač, Boris Mugoša and Branko Radulović are among active ones and paid most attention to social protection, while Branka Tanasijević, Andrija Popović and Radule Novović paid most attention to education and science, in addition to the already mentioned MPs who were active on this topic.

The media and NGOs topic was most discussed by Branka Tanasijević and Andrija Nikolić, followed by Radule Novović and Mihailo Anđušić.

The table below shows the most active MPs on social topics, and a complete overview of the activities of all MPs in this area is provided in Annex 5.

3. ACTIVITIES OF THE MPs WITHIN MOBILE APP "ASK MPs"

In order to improve day-to-day communication between citizens and MPs, NGO MANS developed a mobile application "Ask MPs" for all mobile platforms, as foreseen by implementation plan of this project.

"Ask MPs" application allows citizens to send messages with information on issues in free and open format and communicate with them on various topics, while at the same time, MPs will be able to provide answers by using the same application. This will allow citizens to assess their level of satisfaction with communication with a particular MP, but also to indicate whether the answer was provided by other methods (e.g. e-mail, direct meeting, etc.). This will also provide significant benefit to all MPs who will be able to work more effectively with larger number of citizens and potentially attract new voters. In addition, it will lead to greater competitiveness among MPs to use the application and communicate regularly with citizens.

"Ask MPs" application allows MPs to be more accountable and open in their constituencies, while citizens have effective channels of communication to report their issues to MPs of their choice.

Despite the negative campaign by some MPs, from July to the end of December this year, citizens sent 200 questions to their representatives in the Parliament of Montenegro, of which 70 questions were answered.

SDP MPs received most questions - Draginja Vuksanović Stanković (21 questions) and Raško Konjević (10 questions), while Andrija Popović, MP from SD and LP MPs Group, received nine questions. Nine questions also received DPS MP Aleksandra Vuković, but she did not reply. Eight questions each received MPs Aleksandar Damjanović and Branka Bošnjak, while six questions each were addressed to Aleksa Bečić and Nebojša Medojević. Other MPs received five or less questions.

68 MPs received questions from interested citizens through the mobile app. Five MPs received 5 questions, 7 MPs received four questions, and 14 MPs received three questions. 13 MPs received two questions and 21 MPs received one question.

MPs of the MPs Group Democrats, although they are boycotting the work of Parliament, were active in this activity and answered all questions posed through via "Ask MPs" app.

4. SITTINGS OF THE PARLIAMENT

In the period from May 1 to December 31, 2019, there were 10 ordinary, 6 special and one extraordinary sitting of the Parliament of Montenegro, with a total of 126 agenda items.

4.1. OVERVIEW OF SITTINGS

An overview of the agenda items of all sittings is given in the table below.

There were 126 items on the agenda in the observed period. Out of the total number of items, 4 concerned the Prime Minister's Hour and MPs questions, and 2 concerned MPs questions and they are not voted on at the sittings of the Parliament of Montenegro, while eight items referred to the elections and appointments.

Within items referring to elections and appointments, 50 sub-items were discussed. Eight sub-items within the item of election and appointments related to the Proposal of candidates for the election of members of the Judicial Council from among distinguished lawyers, which was twice voted on during this reporting period, and they were not adopted because there was no necessary two-thirds majority.

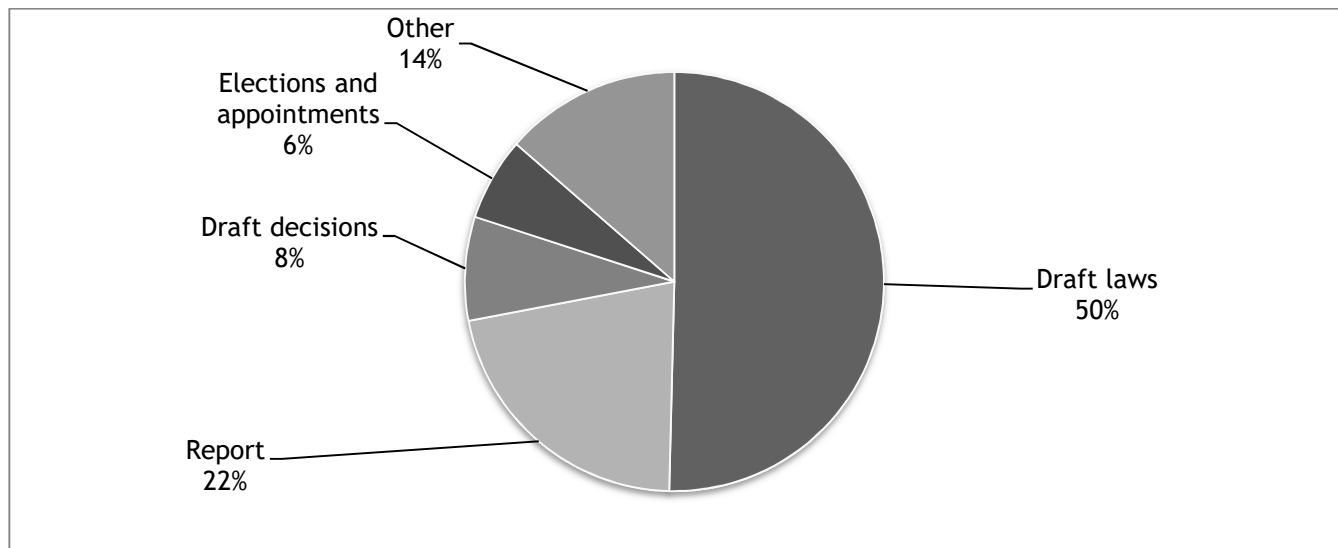
The draft Law on Election of Councillors and MPs was withdrawn from the procedure by the proposer of the group of MPs of the ruling coalition.

At the Fourth sitting of the Second Ordinary session, which was covered by the previous report, three draft laws were discussed, but they were not voted on in this reporting period. Those are the Draft Law on Amendments to the Law on Civil Procedure, the Draft Law on Amendments to the Law on state symbols and the statehood day of Montenegro, while the Draft Law on the life partnership of the same sex persons was not adopted.

4.2. AGENDA

In the observed period, draft laws were most frequently discussed, and they were on the agenda 63 times. They are followed by reports with 27 items, draft decisions were discussed 10 times, while the item elections and appointments accounted to eight items of the agenda.

Below is a list of agenda items discussed most frequently at the sittings of the Parliament. The group named "other" includes Prime Minister's Hour and MPs questions, Prime Minister's Hour, Draft Laws on Ratification of the Convention and Draft Laws on the Ratification of the Protocol, draft laws on ratification of the Agreement, draft strategies, draft resolutions, draft financial plans, code of ethics drafts and approvals. These topics were 17 times on the agenda at the sittings of the Parliament.

According to data presented, most frequently discussed were draft laws, which were on the agenda 63 times. They are followed by discussions on the reports that were on the agenda 27 times, draft decisions had 10 items, while elections and appointments were 8 times on the agenda. The Prime Minister's Hour and MPs' questions had 4 items, while draft resolutions were discussed 3 times during this reporting period.

There was a somewhat smaller number of items when it comes to the draft laws on the Ratification of the Protocol, which had two items of the agenda, same as the Prime Minister's Hour.

In the observed period, one item each was dedicated to the draft strategy, draft financial plans, Draft Law on Ratification of the Convention, Draft Code of Ethics, Draft Law on Ratification of the Agreement and approvals.

In the observed period, four Special Sittings of the Parliament of Montenegro⁶ were organized which were dedicated to the Prime Minister's Hour and MPs' questions. At these sitting, the Prime Minister was asked 33 questions by MPs, while 276 MPs' questions were addressed to representatives of the Government, to which they gave answers.

4.3. DURATION OF SITTINGS

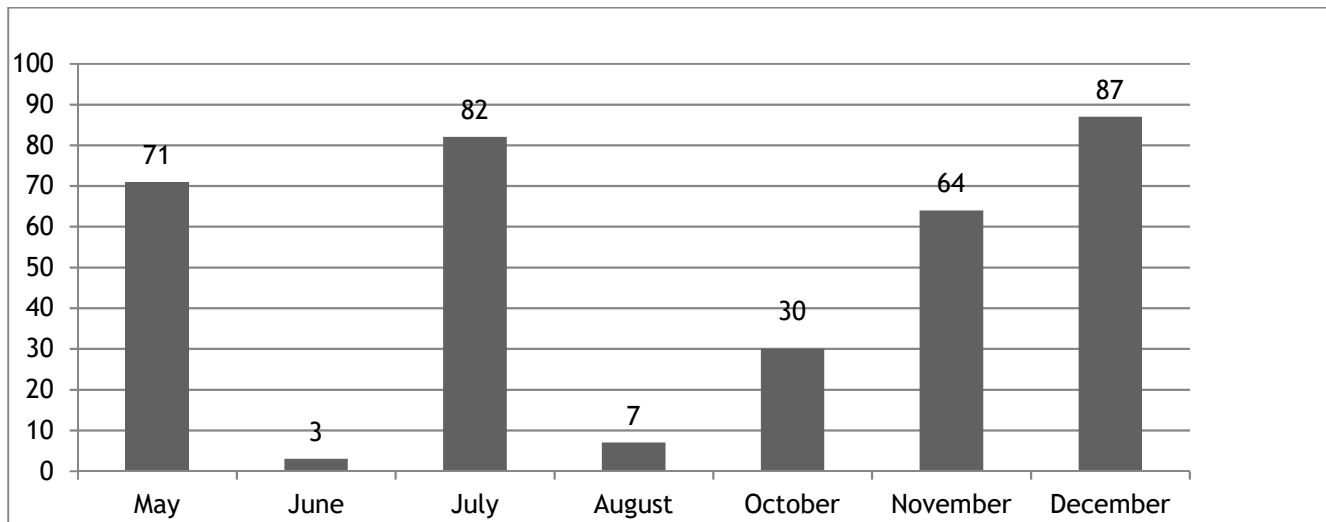
In the period from May 01 to December 31, 2019, 17 sittings of the Parliament were held, in a total duration of 345 hours. 6th Sitting of the First Ordinary Session lasted longest, 55 hours, while the 8th Special sitting of the Second Ordinary Session lasted around 3 hours. Items on the agenda at the 6th Sitting of the First Ordinary Session were draft laws, reports, draft decisions, strategies, elections and appointments. At the 8th Special sitting in 2019, an item was dedicated to the Prime Minister's Hour.

⁶ The Rules of Procedure of the Parliament of Montenegro in Article 187 para. 3 and 4 stipulate: "A parliamentary question shall be put at a special session of the Parliament held no less than once in a two-month period during an ordinary session. A question to the Prime Minister referred to in paragraph 3 of this Article shall be put at the beginning of the session, and in the month when this session is not held, at a special session dedicated to the Prime Minister's Hour - Prime Minister's Hour."

5. CONTROL FUNCTION OF THE PARLIAMENT

Besides its legislative function, the Parliament of Montenegro has the obligation to control the work of the executive authorities. In order to carry out its control function efficiently, the Parliament has at its disposal a set of mechanisms⁷ to request from the executive authorities to provide information, but also to recommend or impose the implementation of specific activities in order to overcome certain issues.

5.1. USE OF CONTROL MECHANISMS

In the period from May 1 to December 2019, 2019, working bodies of the Parliament organized a total of 17 hearings, of which 14 were consultative and 3 control hearings. The control hearing is a mechanism of the Parliament of Montenegro for controlling the work of other branches of the government and independent institutions supervised by the Parliament, which checks the current or past situation or activity in a particular area or institution, and provides guidance for improvement through opinions and conclusions.

Consultative hearing is more of advisory than the control activity that the Parliament uses in order to collect, from various subjects in society, various types of information or stances on certain law, appointment, occurrence or work of a particular institution, including those that are not subject to supervision of the Parliament.

In mentioned meetings, 110 people were questioned, divided into two groups, so the first one consisted of 41 representatives of the ministries, while the second group named "others" had 69 persons in total.

The group "others" consists of representatives of the High State Prosecutor's Office, the Basic State Prosecutor's Office, the Institute for the Execution of Criminal Sanctions, the Protector of Human Rights and Freedoms of Montenegro, administrations, agencies, funds, public institutions, communities, chambers, unions and associations. Annex 6 contains information on all persons who participated in the consultative hearings, while Annex 7 contains data of the person who took part in the control hearings.

⁷ The Parliament may organize consultative and controlling hearings and a parliamentary inquiry to obtain all relevant information about a case or occurrence. Moreover, MPs may, by submitting an Interpellation on the work of an executive body, consider specific issues and give their conclusions that are binding for the executive authorities. The Prime Minister's Hour and MPs' questions are also the way in which MPs can perform the control function, asking questions to the Prime Minister and other representatives of the executive authorities, who are obliged to answer them.

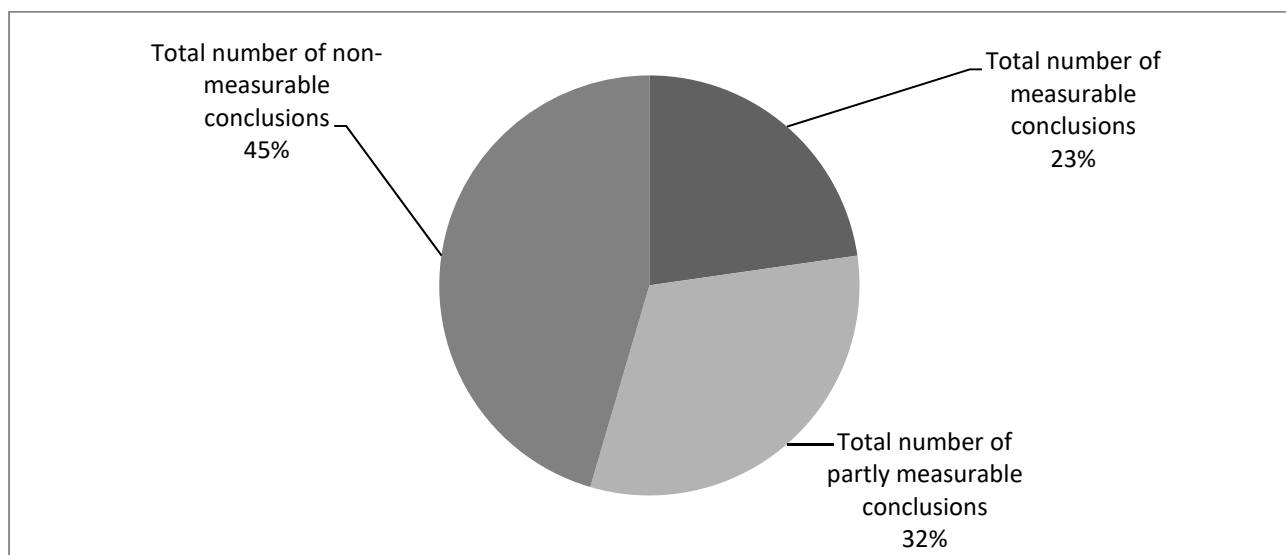
5.2. CONCLUSIONS

In the period from May 1 to December 31, 2019, a total of 41 conclusions, of which 20 non-measurable conclusions, 12 partly measurable and 9 measurable conclusions⁸ were published on the website of the Parliament and in the Official Gazette of Montenegro.

Out of the total number of measurable or partly measurable conclusions, 7 were adopted by the working bodies of the Parliament, while other conclusions were adopted at the plenary sessions of the Parliament of Montenegro.

All conclusions are divided into measurable, non-measurable and partly measurable, which are in line with the conclusions of the methodology that were discussed at the very beginning of the report.

Parliamentary committees announced that they would adopt two more conclusions from the control hearings that were held during this reporting period.

In the observed period, 21 conclusions related to ministries in the Government of Montenegro. In addition to referring to ministries, the conclusions refer to other institutions as well: the Central Bank of Montenegro, the Fund for Protection and Exercise of Minority Rights and the Protector of Human Rights and Freedoms, the Police Directorate, the Institute for the Execution of Criminal Sanctions, agencies, committees, councils, chambers, communities, municipalities.

Most conclusions concerned the Ministry of Health and Police Directorate, 5 each. Four conclusions related to the Ministry of Finance, the Protector of Human Rights and Freedoms, the Ministry for Human and Minority Rights, the Ministry of the Interior and the European Integration Office, while 3 conclusions were referred to the Ministry of Justice. The Parliament referred two conclusions to the Central Bank of Montenegro, the Agency for National Security, Energy Regulatory Agency, the Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare, the Ministry of Education, the Insurance Supervision Agency and the Ministry of Sustainable Development and Tourism. One conclusion was referred to other institutions, and their overview is in the table below.

⁸ During the previous reporting period, control and consultative hearings were held, but conclusions were adopted during this reporting period. There are three such conclusions, two are partially measurable, while one is measurable and they are included in the statistics of this report.

V COMMITTEE ON FURTHER REFORM OF ELECTORAL AND OTHER LEGISLATION

On 30 November 2018, at the plenary session, MPs voted for forming of the Committee on Further Reform of Electoral and Other Legislation aimed at establishing dialogue and strengthening of the public trust in the electoral process. The Committee consists of seven representatives from the ruling coalition and seven from the opposition parties. Branimir Gvozdenović, the vice-president of the Parliament, was elected chair of the Committee, while DF MP, Strahinja Bulajić, was elected deputy chair. For the first time since the forming of the 26th convocation of the Parliament, the ruling party and the opposition found a compromise and saw the forming of this Committee as a key interest for Montenegro and its further integration into the European Union.

Two associate members of the Committee from the academic community are Prof. Dr. Đorđije Blažić and MA Boris Bastijančić, while three associate members from NGO sector are: NGO Network for Affirmation of NGO Sector (MANS), Center for Democratic Transition (CDT) and Civic Alliance (GA). The Committee consists of seven working groups that individually deal with a set of laws related to electoral legislation.

At working group meetings, it was agreed that the methodology of work would be based on a thorough analysis of the already existing legal framework with an emphasis on the consideration and implementation of good practices in the field of electoral legislation from the neighbouring countries and the countries of the European Union, as well as the efforts to implement recommendations from the reports of OSCE/OIDHR, international institution dealing with monitoring of elections.

Members of the Committee from DF and the opposition started a boycott of the Committee due to arrest of MP Nebojša Medojević and order for the arrest of Milan Knežević in November last year. After MP Nebojša Medojević was released, MPs of DF and the opposition continued the boycott demanding the forming of a technical government.

Members of the Committee from the ruling party, academic community and civil sector continued to work in certain working groups on certain electoral solutions without the presence of DF members. Namely, in July, there was a dialogue between the ruling parties and the Democratic Montenegro, after which a decision was adopted to complete the composition of the Parliamentary Committee, and MPs from Democrats, Momo Koprivica and Danilo Šaranović were elected members of the Committee.

MANS is an associate member of three working groups dealing with the following laws: Amendments to the Law on Voters' Register; (Working Group 2); Amendments to the Law on Registers of Temporary and Permanent Residence; Analysis of the implementation of the Law on Identity Card and the Law on Montenegrin Citizenship; Amendments to the Law on Financing of Political Entities and Election Campaigns (Working Group 5); Strengthening of capacities and professionalism in the work of bodies relevant to election processes, including the State Election Commission and the Agency for Prevention of Corruption (Working Group 6). In addition, MANS also monitored other meetings of the working groups of the Committee in the monitoring capacity.

The decision to set up the Committee provided for electoral laws to be completed by October 15, but despite intensive work within all working committees, the deadline was first extended to November 15 and then to December 18, 2019. OSCE/ODIHR and Venice Commission experts, during the work of this Committee, provided guidance, made recommendations, evaluated the work on the legislation, and welcomed what was done by the Committee.

Although it was planned that the legal solutions would be completed by the end of the first week of December, Democrat MPs Momo Koprivica and Danilo Šaranović left the Committee due to submitting to the parliamentary procedure the Draft Law on freedom of religion because they claimed that it was not supported by all three traditional religions in Montenegro, and that this would lead to new divisions among citizens.

The Committee ceased to operate because it did not have a quorum to decide, while MPs of the ruling coalition submitted to the parliamentary procedure and voted to adopt a set of laws that were worked on within the working committees. These are: Draft Law on Financing of Political Entities and Election Campaigns; Draft Law on Voters' Register; Draft Law on Amendments to the Law on Territorial Organization of Montenegro and Draft Law on Amendments to the Criminal Code of Montenegro. The Draft Law on Election of Councillors and MPs was also included in the parliamentary procedure, however, during the debate, the proposers withdrew it and was not voted on.
