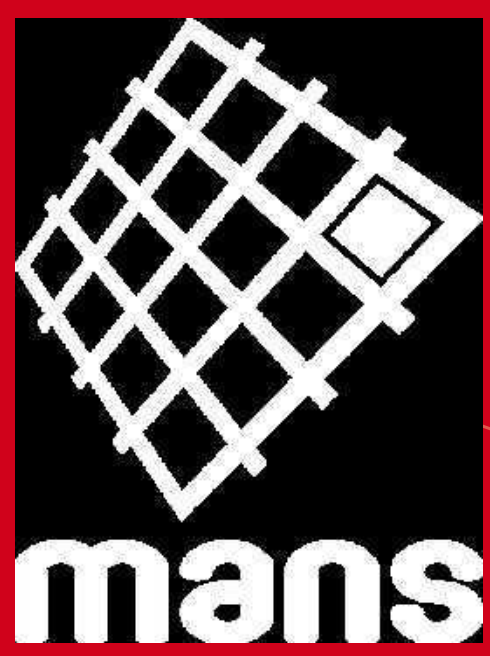

In the part of Budva where the square meter of residential space ranges from 1,500 to 2,500 euros, the Chairman of the Assembly of the Municipality of Budva, Nikola Jovanović, paid only 783 euros/m2. The documentation about this deal obtained by the MANS Investigative Centre shows that Jovanović paid around 85 thousand euros for the 109 m2-apartment and a parking space, while the appraisal of its market value commissioned by Jovanović himself shows that it is worth 143 thousand euros. On the initiative that MANS submitted back in September of last year against the President of the Municipality of Budva, Milo Božović, who has been ignoring the legal obligation to submit a report on his income and assets for two years, the Agency for Prevention of Corruption has just announced the decision. On the other hand, for two years, until MANS filed the initiative, APC has been ignoring its obligation to apply the Law on Prevention of Corruption consistently and without delay. According to the data available on the Agency's website, the appointed public official did not submit regular income and assets statements he had during 2020 and 2021. He also failed to submit several extraordinary statements after leaving his old and entering new public positions during the mentioned two years. 19/01/2023

NGO MANS submitted a criminal complaint to the competent *State Prosecutor's Office* against the **Director of the Agency for Prevention of Corruption (ASK)**, due to the suspicion that she abused her official position in order to obtain benefit for herself and others. Previously, MANS Investigative Centre discovered that **the Director of APC made an illegal decision regarding the use of the motor pool of that institution by assigning to herself and her assistant two passenger vehicles owned by the Agency, for permanent use (24 hours).**

NGO MANS appeals to MPs not to adopt the proposed **Law on Confiscation of Property**, which is contrary to international standards, as it would make it impossible to confiscate property hidden abroad. Ahead of the control hearing in the home parliamentary committee and the session of the *Parliament*, the *European Commission* also expressed concern, as its recommendations were ignored. The NGO MANS urges the *Assembly* to reject the proposed law drafted by personnel from the former regime, which amnesties enrichment from the 90s. **Instead of lustration, those cadres are writing a law on the confiscation of the property of those who appointed them to those positions.** The anti-mafia law should cover all property of public officials and persons associated with organized crime, regardless of when they acquired it. They need to prove the origin of property that deviates from official income, and not for the state to prove criminal acts. MANS points out that the anti-mafia law should establish a special court whose judges will undergo strict control of the origin of assets and connections to organized crime.

The NGO MANS reminds that eight years ago, it uncovered a secret account belonging to *Marović* in Switzerland. That money was never confiscated, as the prosecution did not know from which crime the money was acquired. **How many more secret accounts in Switzerland are waiting for Montenegro to finally have the political will to return that money to the state budget?!** We note that according to the current government proposal for the *Law on Confiscation of Assets*, *Marović* will not have to explain where he got \$3.8 million in a secret Swiss account. **If an official hides multimillion property and it is discovered, the state cannot confiscate it, unless it has evidence that a specific criminal offense has been committed.**

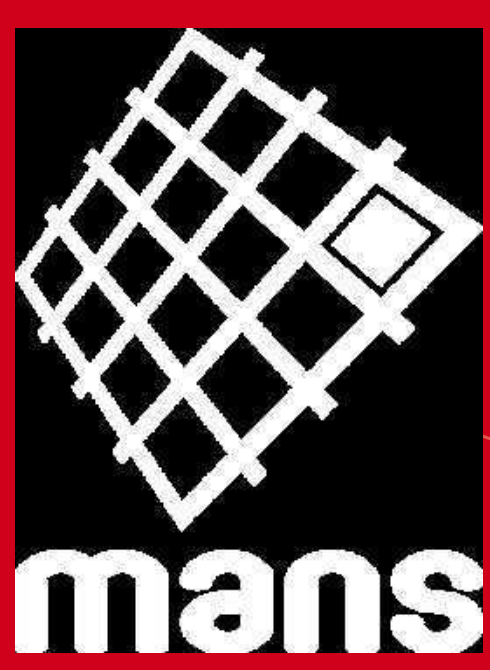


The research center of the NGO MANS has published a new investigative story about the unreported assets of public officials. **Until 2011, an offshore company "Bluray Limited" registered in the Caribbean as owned by husband of *Valentina Pavličić*, who was a judge of the High Court, which never reported to the competent institutions.** In May 2011, the company was sold for 50,000 euros, and instead of cash, *Bemax* transferred ownership of a 46-m² apartment in the "Normal Company" building near the cathedral in *Podgorica* to the name of husband. The lifestyle of officials and persons related to them, which cannot be justified by official income, hidden companies, assets, income, are the first alarms for possible corrupt behavior, trading in influence and abuse of official position.

As the Democratic Front (DF) coalition hid all expenses of political marketing on Pink M and Adria TV in the campaign for local elections, MANS submitted reports to the Agency for Prevention of Corruption (APC). An analysis of official reports on campaign expenses, election lists of DF in Podgorica, Budva, Bar, Pljevlja and Plav revealed that they **did not report a single cent of advertising expenses on the mentioned TV channels. It was the selective interpretation of the law by the APC that made this kind of behavior possible and opened the door to illegal financing of election campaigns from abroad.** 09/03/2023



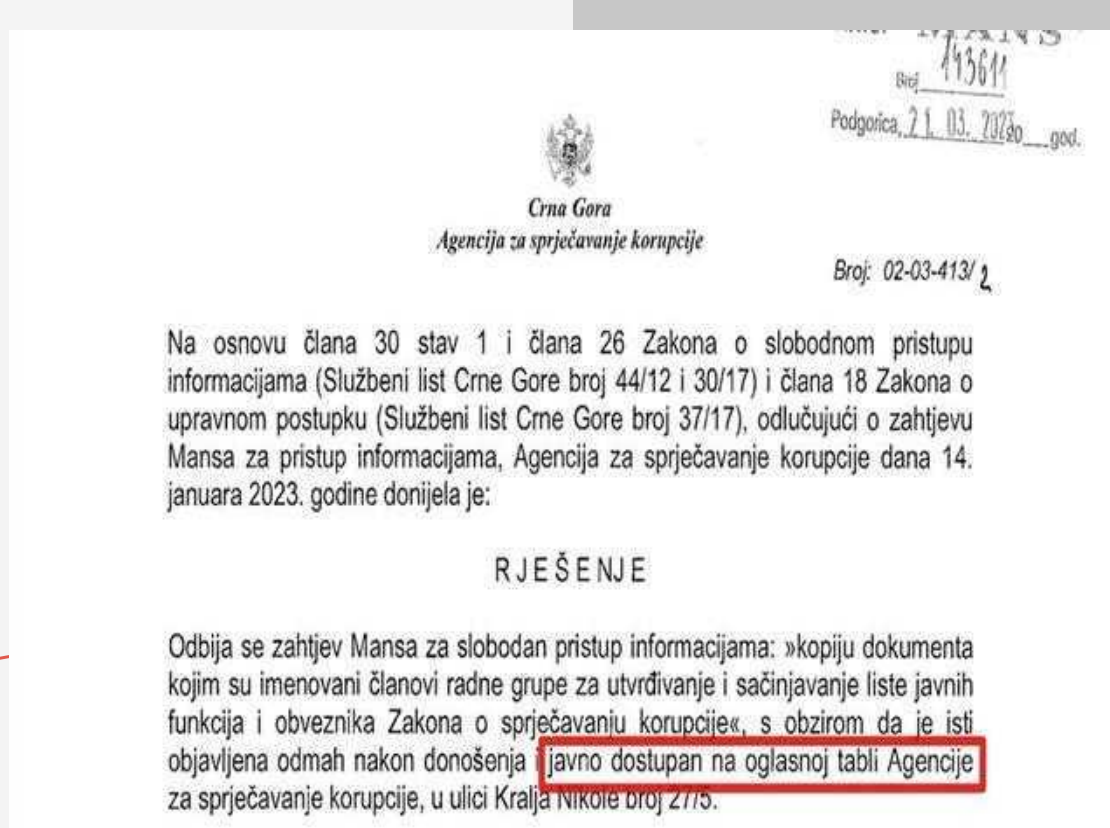
The Institute Alternative and MANS urged that all intelligence and security data not be exempt from the application of the Law on Free Access to Information, as well as that the provisions according to which former public officials are not subject to exceptions to privacy protection and tax secret protection be reinstated. Draft Law on Free Access to Information established by the Government on March 7, 2023 contains important negative differences compared to the previous draft, which was withdrawn from the parliamentary procedure upon forming of the 43rd Government. The previous draft law to a greater extent respected the arguments of NGOs that took part in the previously held public debate. 10/03/2023



The Government's Commission for allocation of funds from the budget reserve before the elections paid out as much as 134 thousand euros for various types of social benefits, thus continuing the practice of all previous governments to allocate these types of funds without clearly defined and transparent criteria just before the election processes. For a long time, MANS and other NGOs have been asking for greater transparency and clear criteria for the payment of social benefits which is an appeal to which even the former opposition parties that now make up the executive power did not respond to. This is a practice that needs to be stopped, and until that happens, we cannot talk about fair election process and the release of institutions that should serve citizens, not political parties and their leaders. 15/03/2023

The Agency for Prevention of Corruption (APC) refused, in accordance with the Law on Free Access to Information, to electronically send the decision on the appointment of 11 members of the Working Group, because the document was already available to the public on the notice board in the institution's premises. Although the purpose of the Law on Free Access to Information is to provide citizens and other interested parties with unimpeded and efficient access to information held by state institutions, the Agency with this example shows its intention to conceal or make access to information difficult, particularly to that which needs to increase the transparency of the work of that institution. 28/03/2023

The new attempt by the Prime Minister and Minister of Justice to push through the back door the so-called “anti-mafia law” is a continuation of their personal campaigns, and campaigns of political parties fighting for the census. **MANS called on the members of Montenegrin Parliament not to participate in another trampling on the public interest and the indisputable need of citizens to get a law that will not work in favour of criminals and corrupt state officials after 30 years of injustice. We remind the MPs that citizens have been waiting for justice for decades and that by adopting selective laws, they would show that it is not attainable, but is the subject of rotten political compromises.**

Instead of never suspecting the closest associates who were arrested for organized crime, as well as towards those who suggested them to him, the Prime Minister accuses MANS of uncovering the biggest cases in this country, which is why we were subjected to brutal persecution by the previous regime. **There is no pressure from any government that will make us give up the fight for justice and stop opposing the adoption of a selective law that would absolve all those who acquired enormous illicit wealth during the 90s.** That is why we call on the MPs not to vote for the selective law proposed by the Government, despite the pressures of the outgoing Prime Minister, but to keep the years-long promises that all illegally acquired assets will be confiscated and returned to the state budget.

In an interview with the independent weekly "Monitor", the executive director of MANS reminded that **the criminal offense of money laundering was first introduced into our legal system in 2002, and only since 2010 has the creation of a criminal organization become a separate criminal offense.** Therefore, among other things, she warned that many persons would not be covered by the proposed law, which foresees the existence of a criminal offense as a prerequisite for initiating proceedings. - greater control of officials and officials who make decisions on budget spending (tender commissions).

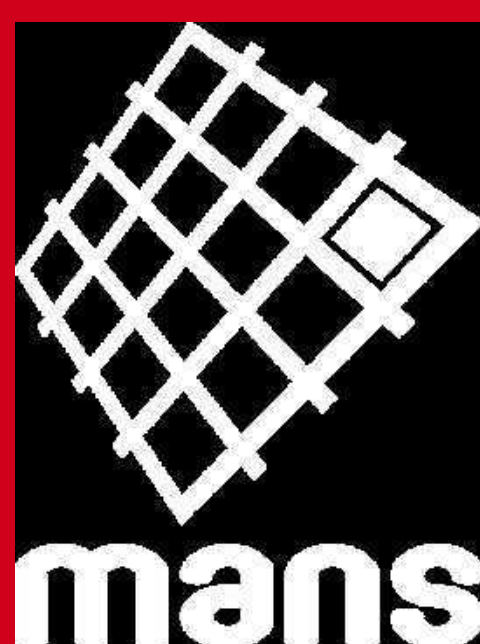

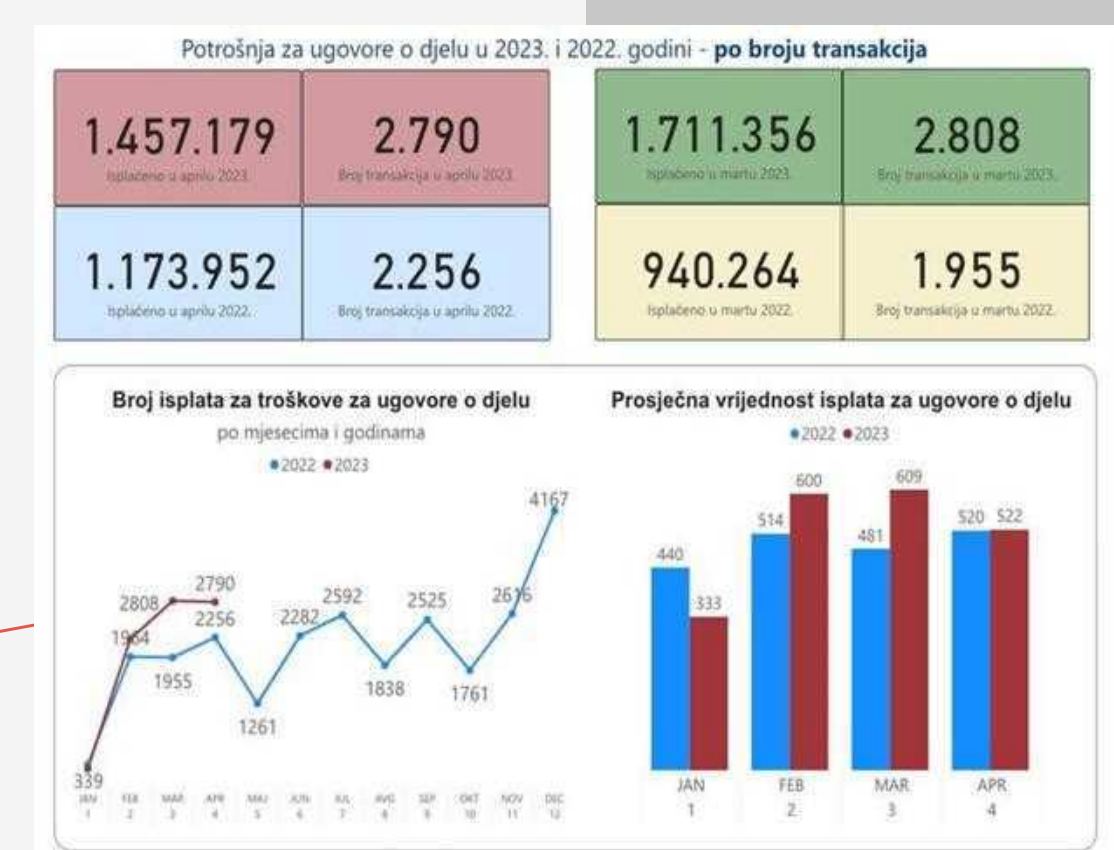




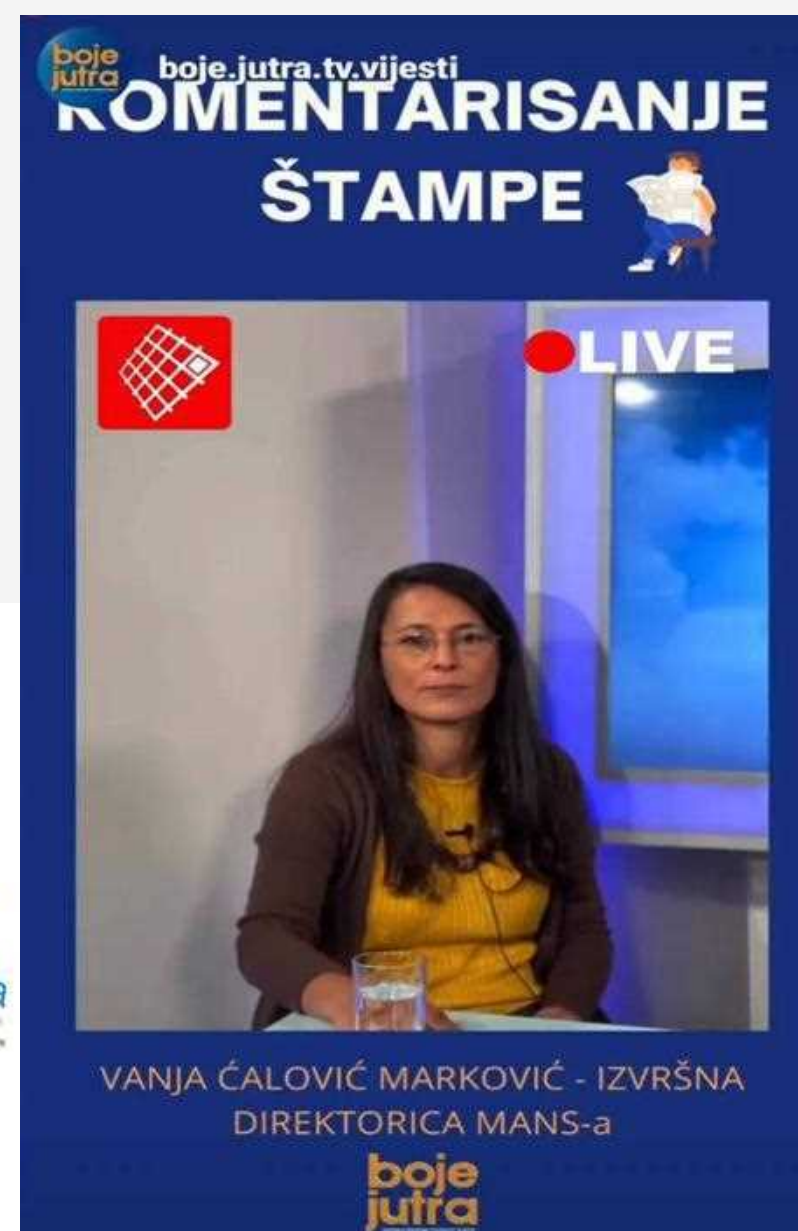

In Montenegro, there is a legal framework that allows public administration to be open, but there is a lack of political will to improve and implement laws, according to Milena Muk, a public policy researcher at the Alternative Institute, and Dejan Milovac, director of the Research Center of the Network for the Affirmation of the Non-Governmental Sector in an interview with the MINA agency. From MANS it was pointed out that society expected that the new government would be interested in showing citizens how certain privatizations took place, how the highway was financed and a whole series of affairs that existed only in media headlines and could not be further investigated.

Action for Human Rights (HRA), the Network for the Affirmation of the Non-Governmental Sector (MANS) and the Association of Lawyers of Montenegro (UPCG) appeal to the existing "dissolved" convocation of the Parliament of Montenegro to suspend the adoption of new laws, in order to preserve constitutionality and legal certainty, because since the passing of the decree on the dissolution of the Assembly, it has had no legitimacy for almost two months, except for the performance of "current and urgent tasks". Also appeal to the Government of Montenegro, which lost confidence more than eight months ago, to suspend legislative initiatives.

Analysis of data on donations received by candidates during the previous presidential campaign revealed numerous suspicions of violations of the Law on Financing Political Parties and Election Campaigns, as well as the continuation of the passive attitude that the Agency for the Prevention of Corruption (APC) has towards the supervision of the implementation of this law. See more details on how election campaigns were financed:

- The campaign of presidential candidate Andrija Mandić was supported by two NGOs with 40 thousand euros;
- One of the donors to the campaign of the elected president Jakov Milatović received jobs from the state in the previous period;
- Presidential campaign of the DPS' candidate, Milo Đukanović, was once again financed by natural persons who received social assistance in the previous period.

In March and April of this year alone, the Government of Montenegro declared as many as 160 individual transactions secret, thus continuing the practice of concealing data on the state budget spending during election campaigns and opening up space for abuses. During those two months, as many as 84 transactions of the National Security Agency and 51 transactions of the Ministry of Defence were hidden from the public. MANS reminds that the concealment of data on the spending of state money, especially in the pre-election period, is a huge incentive for corruption and is a practice that, first of all, the parties that make up the executive power, must abandon without delay ahead of the upcoming extraordinary parliamentary elections.

During the pre-election campaign, in March and April 2023, the Commission for assessing the damage caused by natural disasters of the Government of Montenegro paid out over 800,000 Euros from the budget on the basis of fees, which is eight times more than in the same period last year. The allocation of funds for natural disasters is decided by a commission headed by Zoran Miljanić, Minister without Portfolio, in charge of the fight against corruption. The increase in these payments occurred at the end of last year, after the amendment of Democratic Montenegro banned all other types of payments to natural persons from the budget reserve.

The so-called short-term employment has been recognized in the previous period as one of the mechanisms for illegal influence on the free electoral will of citizens, and one of the key levers for influencing the election result used by the authorities before 2020.

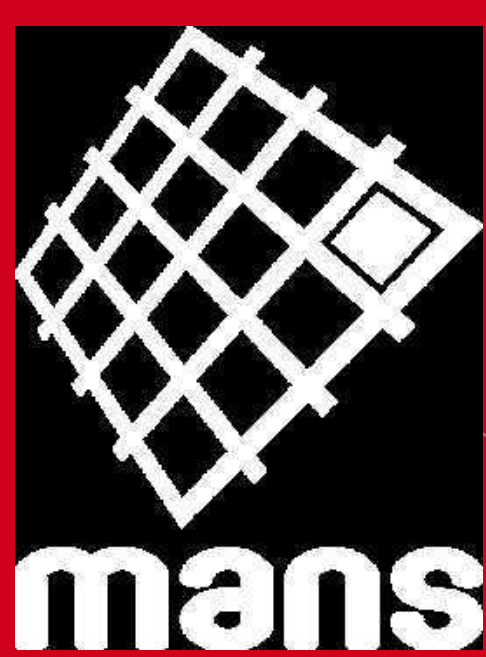
The data on increased payments based on temporary employment contracts in the eve of the extraordinary parliamentary elections show that the old practice has not been completely abandoned, and that the mechanisms that were once criticized by the opposition are now being used unrestrainedly from the position of the government.

That in addition to the amount, the number of payments for temporary employment contracts also increased shows analysis of NGO MANS. During March and April this year, state institutions made as many as 5,600 individual payments based on temporary employment contracts, which is nearly 1,400 payments more compared to the same period last year when there were no elections. This data confirms suspicions that this is new employment and denies the claims of the Prime Minister that the increase in the amount of payments occurred only because individual amounts were increased.

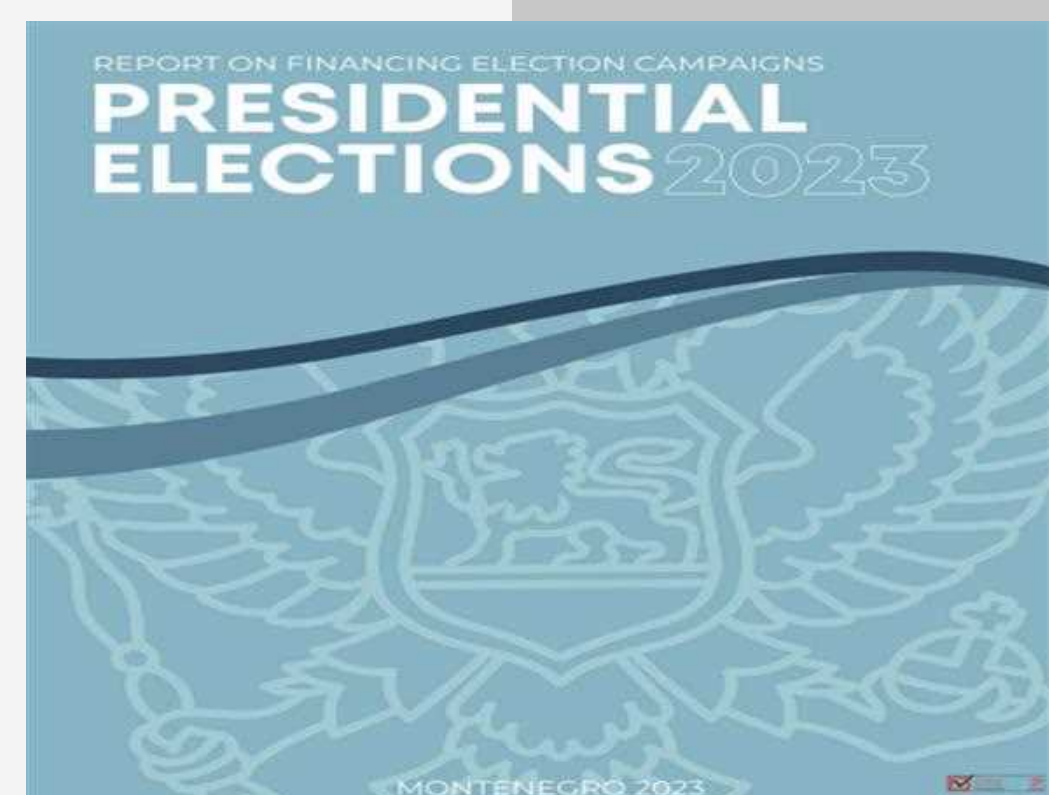
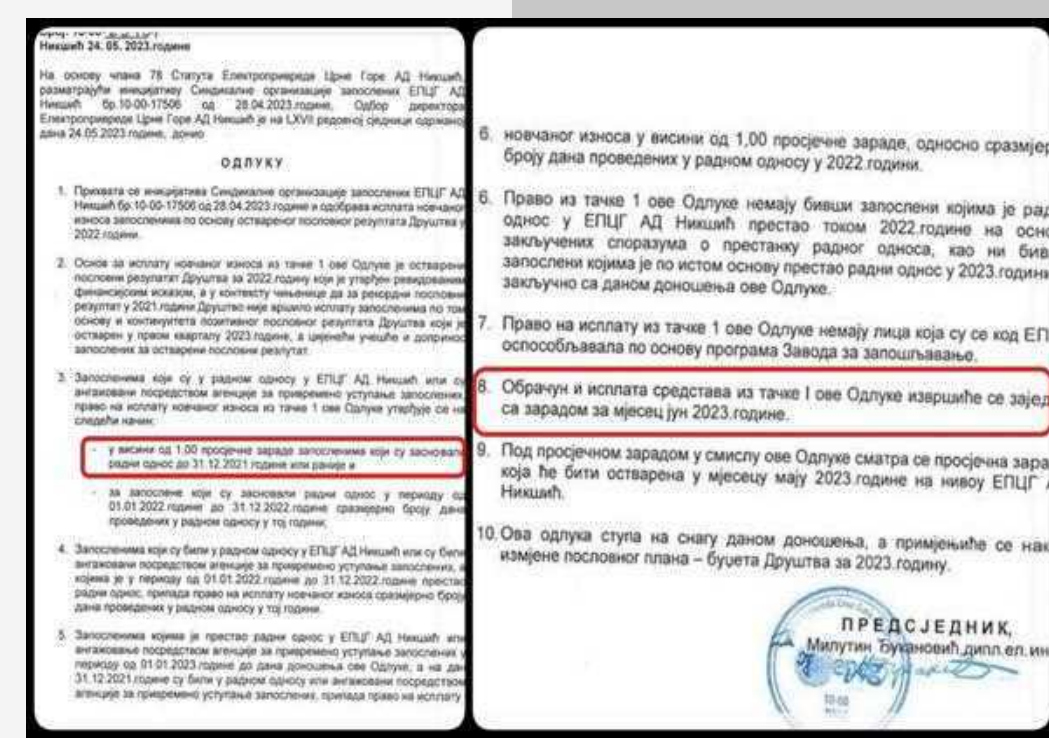

Responding to MANS's initiative to investigate whether the Agency for the Prevention of Corruption (APC) violated the Law on Financing Political Entities and Election Campaigns, the Agency issued a decision declaring itself an independent institution with legal entity status – but not a state authority bound by that particular law. While APC claims that the part of the law requiring the publication of travel orders and fuel expenses for official vehicles doesn't apply to them, MANS argues that the agency's management is using this legal interpretation as a way to freely misuse institutional resources.

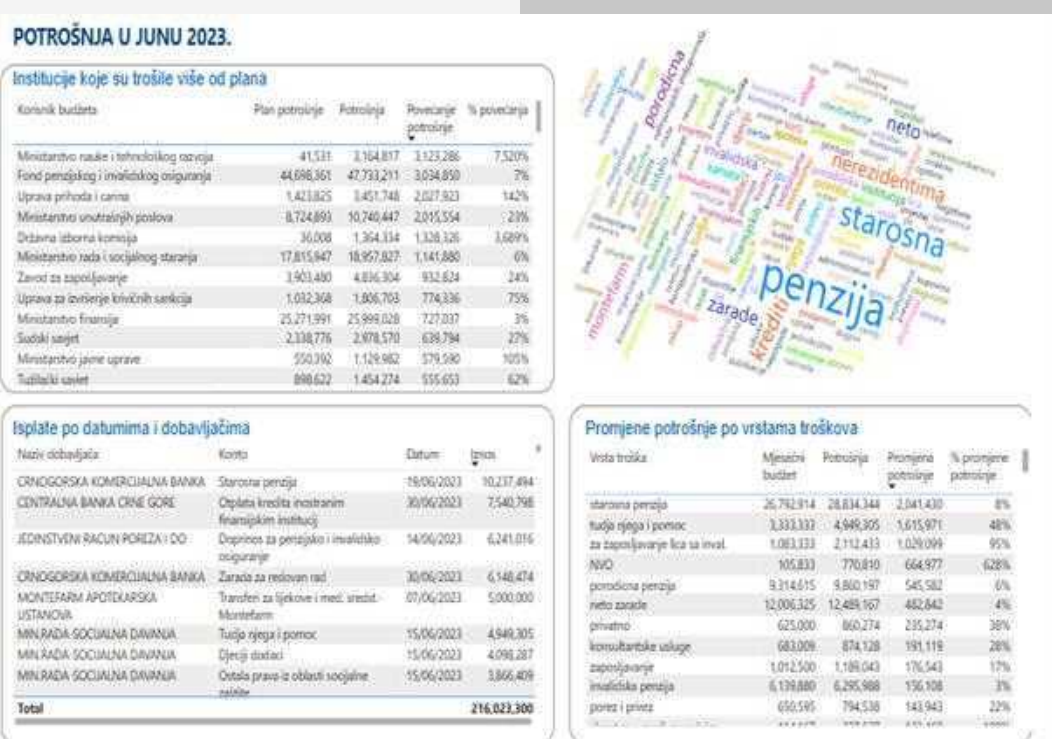

Access to accurate and verified information is one of the necessary prerequisites for responsible journalism, dedicated to the common good and public interest. 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The trend of violations of the Law on the Financing of Political Entities and Election Campaigns, partly caused by an inadequate institutional response and insufficiently developed misdemeanor practice, by state institutions continued during June, when early parliamentary elections were held. This data, analyzed by MANS, shows that some institutions spent more than planned during the election campaign i.e. exceeded the monthly spending limit defined by the Law, especially in the part concerning the possible misuse of state funds. The Network for Affirmation of the NGO Sector (MANS) has called on the new Government to propose a vetting law, with the aim of preventing future instances of justice being administered in the manner seen in the case of a woman from Kolašin, who was fined for exceeding the limits of necessary self-defense after being attacked by a Turkish national. Further supporting the need for such legislation is a ruling by the President of the Misdemeanor Court in Bijelo Polje, a former candidate for the Constitutional Court who had previously received the highest evaluations both as a judge and as court president, who found both individuals involved in the incident guilty of violating the Law on Public Order.

NGO MANS points out that the issue of *lustration or vetting*, the only effective way to cleanse the Montenegrin judiciary of corrupt and unqualified personnel, has not been addressed in the three years since the fall of the previous government. The experience of Albania, which includes verifying the origin of judges' and prosecutors' assets, their potential ties to organized crime, and their professional qualifications, has been confirmed as consistent with international standards by the European Court of Human Rights. 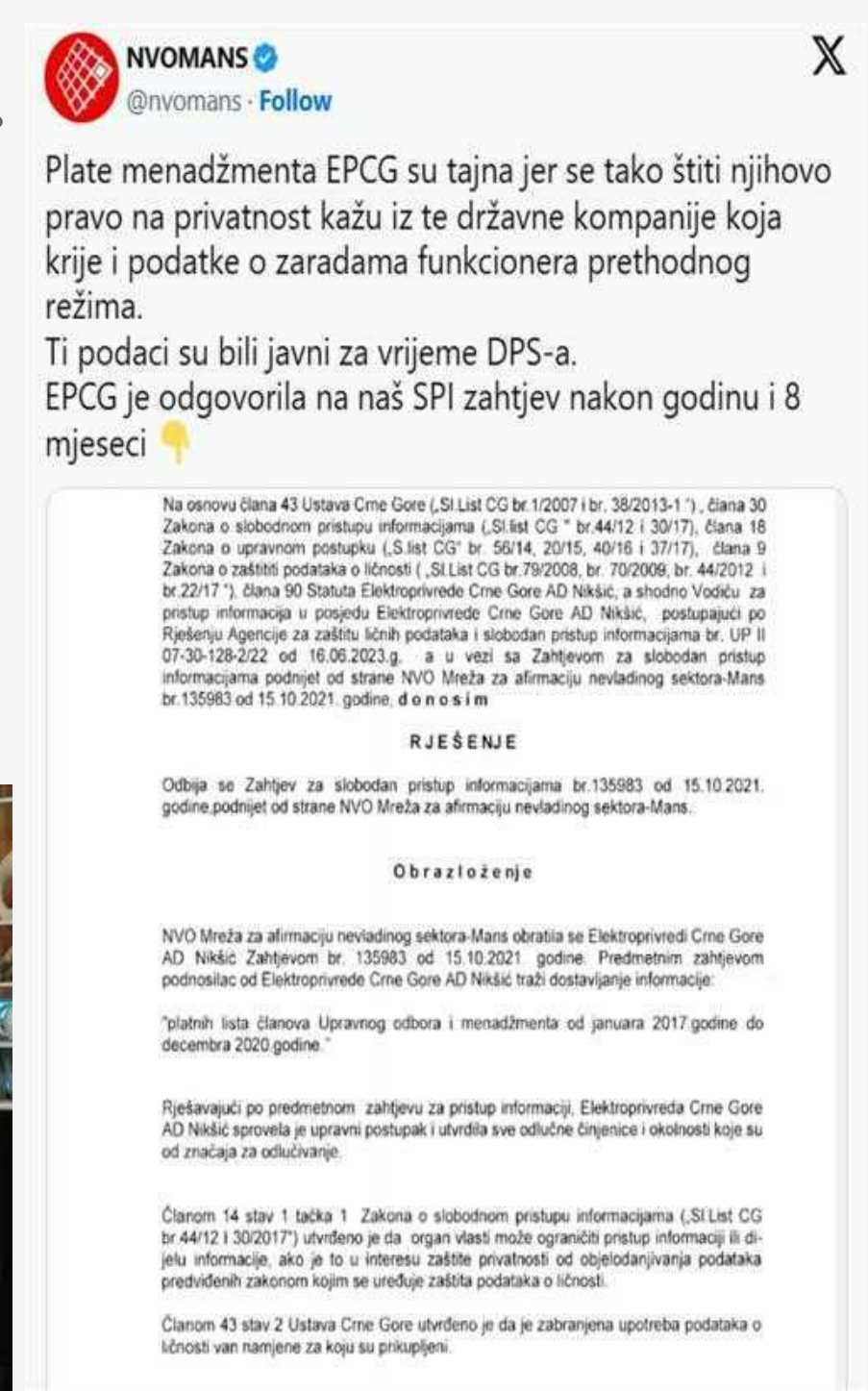
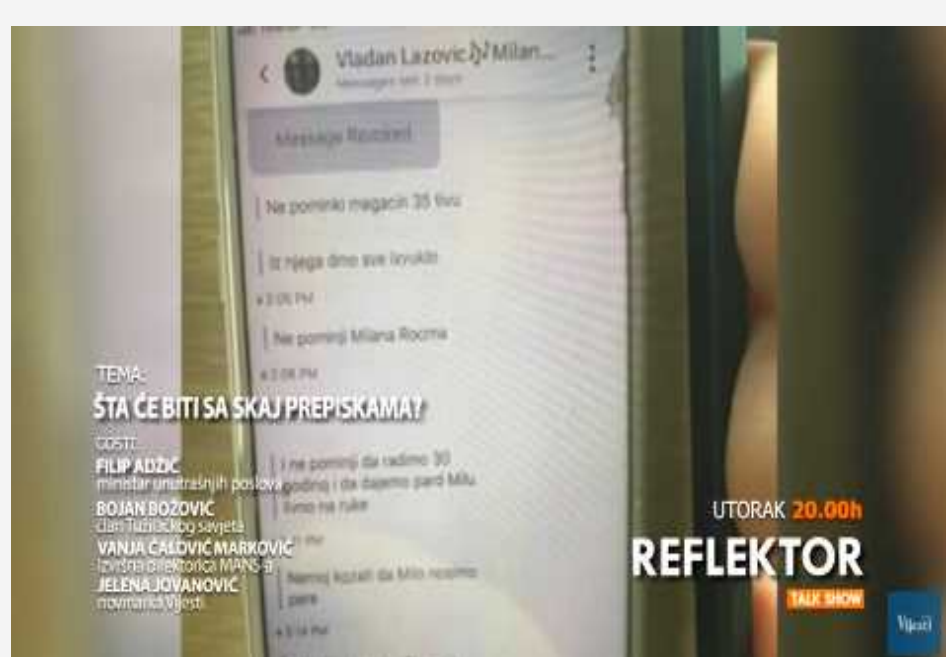
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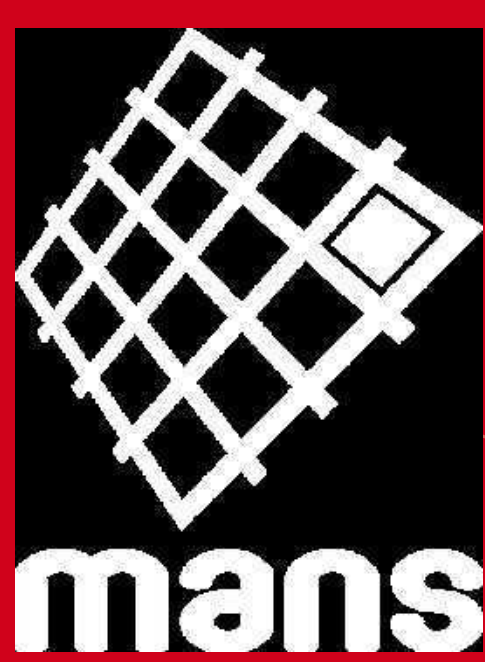

MANS submitted a request to the Secretariat-General of the President of Montenegro for complete documentation on the expenses of the official visit to Croatia and called on the President to use his very example to deviate from the practice fostered by his predecessor. **Bearing in mind that information on the way citizens' money is spent by state institutions is information of public interest, in that regard, its proactive disclosing would be a clear indication of the readiness to contribute to the increase in the transparency of the work of state administration bodies through concrete activities.**

The continuation of such behaviour inevitably leads Montenegro to a new phase of apathy, which was more than immanent during the period of DPS' rule.**

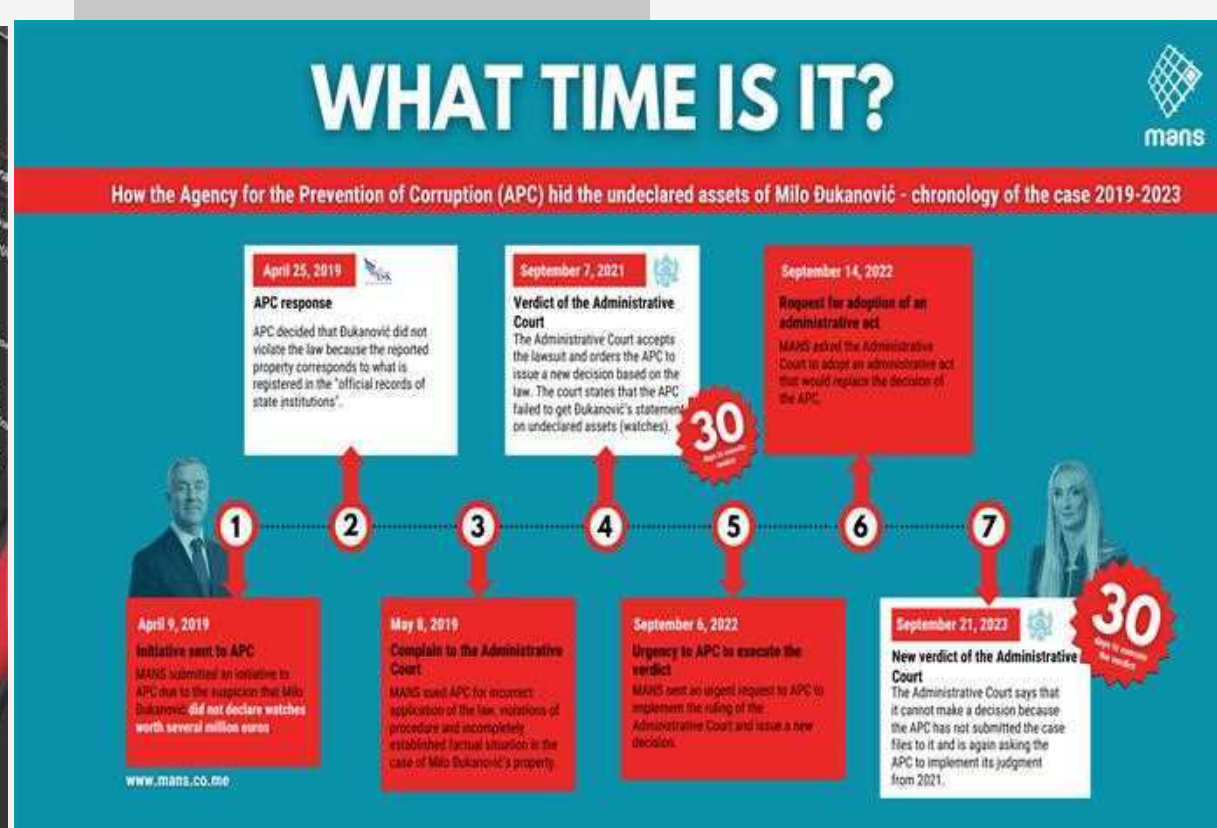


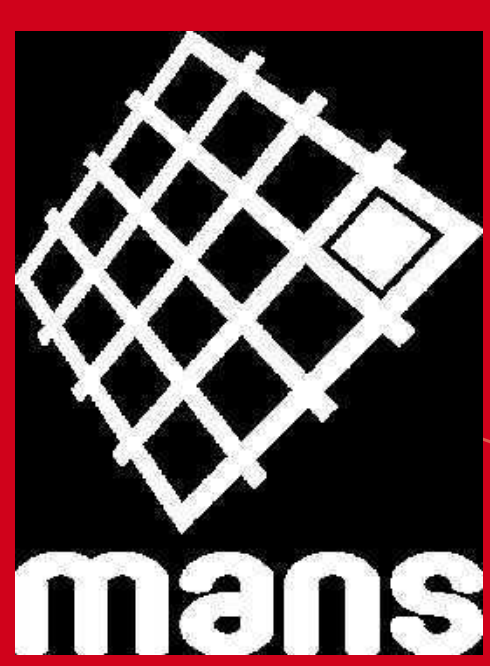
The Administrative Court has passed another judgement in favour of MANS, ordering the Agency for Prevention of Corruption (APC) to start the procedure of checking the report on the revenues and assets of the former Deputy Director of the Police Directorate, **Enis Baković**. MANS filed the initiative back in early 2020, but APC refused to deal with the origin of the money with which Baković bought a plot and a chalet in Žabljak. The data obtained by the MANS Investigative Centre show that Baković was unable to finance the purchase of the real estate worth 15 thousand euros from the officially declared revenues. 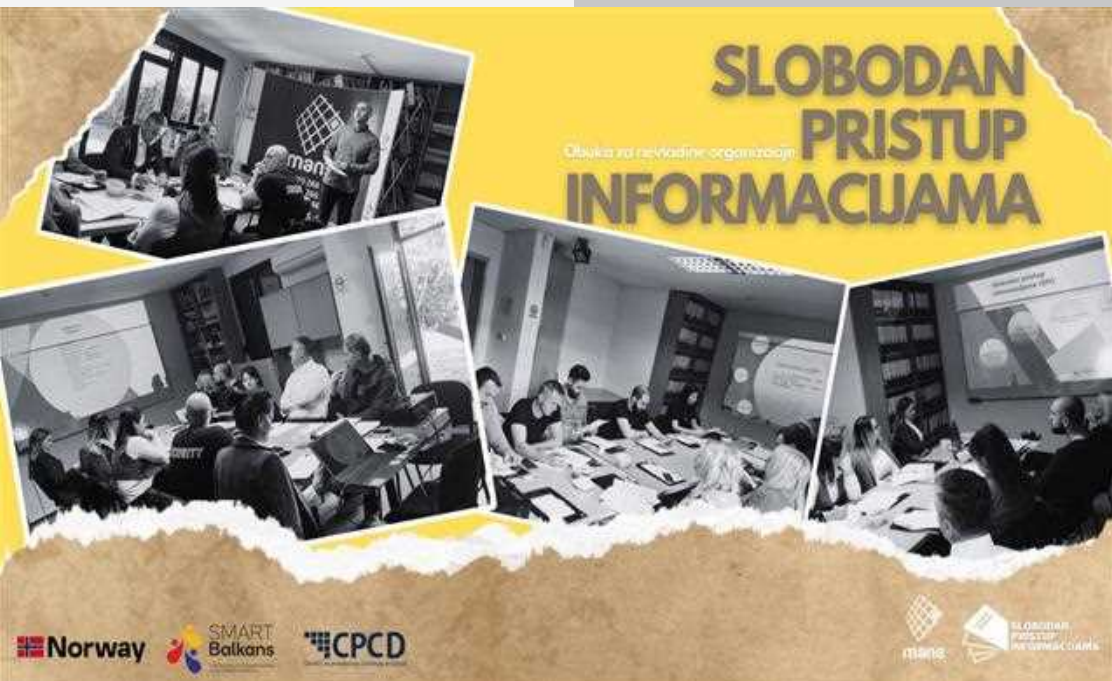

The Agency for Prevention of Corruption (APC) adopted another decision by taking the "word" of a public official instead of reviewing the official data it owns. In its decision, the APC fully believed what it had received as a statement from **Enis Baković**, without additional verification of the income that this former police official used to justify the purchase of real estate in Žabljak.
